Why French?

- Close neighbouring nations, New Caledonia and Vanuatu, speak French.
- French is an official language of the United Nations, UNESCO, NATO, the Olympic Committee, and the International Red Cross.
- French, one of the romance languages is officially spoken in 32 different countries with approximately 75 million mother tongue speakers.
- English has borrowed many words (approximately 45% of modern English words are derived from French) from the French language including such as déjà vu, café, ballet, décor, naïve, restaurant and many more.
